

August Trustee's Report

New Security Issues: A chair and fan were recently “stolen”. Kim Bosley recommended noting these recent thefts in the upcoming Bulletin, and stating Danbury Police have been contacted to investigate.

Column Replacement Update

- Cenaxo has completed the column repair work, per the scope of work and scope changes made, based on additional damages/issues found during repairs.
(There are a few items to be completed by church members (fit and finish, new box, new doors).
- Kevin O’Shea is building the new box to remount the electrical items removed by church members prior to Cenaxo on site (speaker, exit light, etc).
- New speaker has been donated to replace old unit (25 ++ years old).
- Larry Bornemeier to purchase new exit sign, and have Zeke Zahara install by end of month.
- Kevin O’ is planning install new doors soon
- Barrett Roofing will finish their original roofing contract in September, to complete the project and ensure warranty from roofing material manufacturer.

Insurance Claim Update

- A second structural engineer completed an inspection of the damaged column in late July. His observations during inspection stated that there was a lightning strike on the column, based on visual observance of an entry and exit point on the damaged column.
- Structural engineer still needs to write up his report, as insurance company has not received as of 8/3/16.

Disposition of Old Sign

- No response from Litchfield family to letter sent by church a few months ago. Old sign will be scrapped. Church will plant two new shrubs “in honor” of Litchfield family in early fall.

New Sign Completion Update

- Signorama has completed all fabrication, installation punchlist items in July.
- There is still an issue when changing letters, as there is no method to hold the clear vinyl cover out of the way – Kathy Roig is using sticks to hold it up. Larry B to discuss issue with Kathy R to see if it’s acceptable or we need to find a “solution”.
- Larry B to work with Zeke Z in late August-September on options to get electrical power from building out to signs.

Space Users Agreement – Hold Harmless UMCD

- All but two groups that use our church now have their own insurance. Those two groups are considering purchasing, or will sign our hold harmless document. Larry B is working with them.

Church Grounds Needs

- New doors are in church, need other tools (Kevin) to provide to cut the hinges. Larry B and Kevin O’ are working on getting new door frames.


Parsonage Needs
